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1990 Population Estimates for Utah and Its Counties

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According to the estimates from the Population Estimates Committee, the population of Utah reached 1,729,000 as of July 1, 1990, which represents an increase of 24,000, or 1.4 percent over the revised 1989 figure of 1,705,000. This is the largest percent increase in the last six years. Utah's estimate includes the preliminary natural increase of 26,619 persons, and an implied net out-migration of almost 1,900.

The April 1, 1990 Census yielded a count of 1,722,850 people in the State of Utah. A July 1, 1990 estimate was then prepared by the Population Estimates Committee. It might be asked why a population estimate was prepared during a Census year. There were two main reasons for producing this estimate: 1) to maintain a comparable time series (intercensal estimates are centered on July 1 of each year); and 2) to examine population changes in the past year (1989-90).

Thirteen counties in Utah gained population in the last year. Nine counties declined in population, and seven counties had no appreciable change in population over the last year. Most of Utah's population increase occurred in two counties: Salt Lake (9,000) and Utah (8,000). These two counties accounted for over 70 percent of the state's increase in 1990. Daggett county had the largest growth rate for the year (7.7 percent); however, because of Daggett county's size, the actual increase was only 50 people. Washington and Summit counties tied for second fastest growth in the state, with 4 percent each, followed by Utah and Iron counties, with 3.1 and 2.5 percent respectively.

Natural increase, which is the measure of births minus deaths, was the second lowest number since 1976. The period from July 1, 1989 through June 30, 1990, showed both births and deaths staying fairly constant compared to the previous year.

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Utah experienced substantial employment growth during 1989-90, and it is often assumed that given this increase, Utah should be experiencing a net in-migration of population. This is not the case for the past year. While there has been a dramatic decrease in net out-migration (from -6,300 in 1989 to -1,900 in 1990), there has still been net out-migration in the state in the past year.

Table 1 displays, county by county, the natural increase and implied net migration resulting from the revised 1989 and preliminary 1990 population estimates. It is important to note that while there has been a substantial decrease in the net out-migration for the state, this positive change carries over to only a very few counties. Only nine counties experienced any net in-migration in the last year, and of these, only five experienced more than a net increase of 60 people. The significance of this is that population growth resulting from migration can mainly be imputed to three counties: Summit (+433), Utah (+2,153), and Washington (+1,326). While the net out-migration is expected to decline further this year, it must be noted that the state-level positive changes do not necessarily translate into state-wide changes of the same magnitude.

Growth in the Decade of the 1980s

Utah's population increased by 261,813 (from 1,461,037 on April 1, 1980 to 1,722,850 on April 1, 1990) during the decade of the 1980s. This increase was due entirely to births in the state. Since natural increase for the decade was 292,000, there is an implied net out-migration of over 30,000 for the decade of the 1980s.

The metropolitan counties of the Wasatch Front -- Davis, Utah, Salt Lake and Weber -- grew by 28.3, 20.9, 17.3 and 9.5 percent, respectively, in the 1980s. The state growth for the same period was 17.9 percent. These metropolitan counties also remained the four largest in the state, accounting for over 75 percent of total state population. Salt Lake county remains the largest county in the state, accounting for 42 percent of the total state population.

The fastest growing counties -- Washington and Summit - grew by 86.3 and 52.2 percent respectively. This growth for Washington county

translates into an annual average rate of change of over 6 percent per year.

Six counties (Piute, Carbon, Emery, Daggett, Rich and Grand) actually lost population over the last ten years. Each of the counties which experienced loss was heavily dependent on energy-related development, which declined dramatically in the 1980s.

The Demographic and Economic Analysis Section of the State Office of Planning and Budget has prepared the first in a series of Census Briefs: "Cities and Counties of Utah". This report contains more analysis regarding county growth in the 1980s. The series of briefs is designed to analyze specific data derived from the 1990 Census of Population and Housing. Methodology for Estimating Population

In order to produce a 1990 estimate consistent with the Census count, the Population Estimates Committee first produced a 1990 estimate using an average of the two standard methodologies of School Enrollment and L.D.S. Membership Methods. The 1990 methodologies used the 1989 estimate produced last year by the Committee as their origin. The Committee then made the assumption that the annual growth rate implied by averaging the two methodologies was reliable. The 1989-90 growth rates, by county, were then applied to the 1990 Census counts by county. To establish a 1989 revised estimate, 75 percent of the 1989-90 growth rate was subtracted from the April 1 Census; while 25 percent of the same growth rate was added on to the April 1 count. The result of this procedure was that a 1.4 percent growth was maintained for the state for the past year, while 'centering' on the actual population count as of April 1.

The school enrollment method compares a county's survived enrollment in grades 1-8 for the previous year to grades 2-9 in the present years. The difference between the two enrollment totals is taken to be net student migration for the county. Total net migration for the county is then derived by multiplying the county's student migration estimate by the county-specific total population-to-student ratio. This ratio is defined as the total population

estimate for the county for the previous year divided by the previous year's grades 1-8 school enrollment. The second component of the school enrollment method is the calculation of natural increase in the county. Natural increase for any year is defined as the number of births minus the number of deaths. This method is limited in estimating migration among the retired, college students, single persons and other groups that are not represented in school enrollment estimates.

The L.D.S. membership method uses a total population to L.D.S. membership ratio which is obtained by dividing the previous year's population of that year's L.D.S. membership. This ratio is applied to the current L.D.S. membership to obtain a county population estimate. This method is relatively accurate in areas with high proportions of L.D.S. membership and low migration rates.

Intercensal Population Estimates for the 1980s

The Population Estimates Committee is in the process of preparing a revised set of intercensal estimates for the 1980s based on the 1990 Census counts. This process will take a number of months, and will make use of detailed Census data as it becomes available. It is possible that when the set of estimates is completed, the 1989 estimate may be slightly different, but no significant changes are expected.

The Estimates Committee will also be conducting an extensive evaluation of its methodologies. This will result in improvements from either the updating or expanding of methods to better estimate population in Utah in the 1990s.

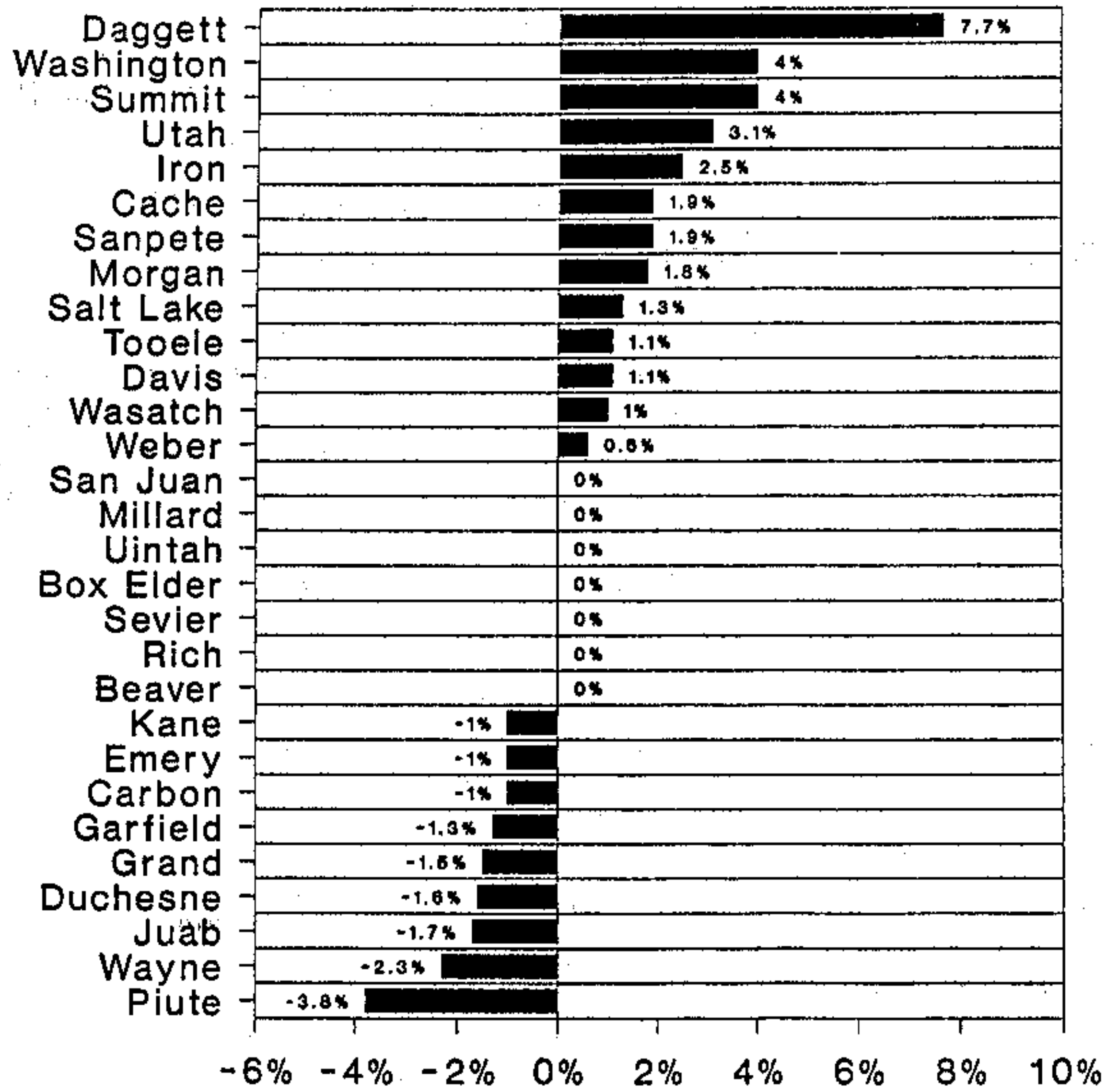

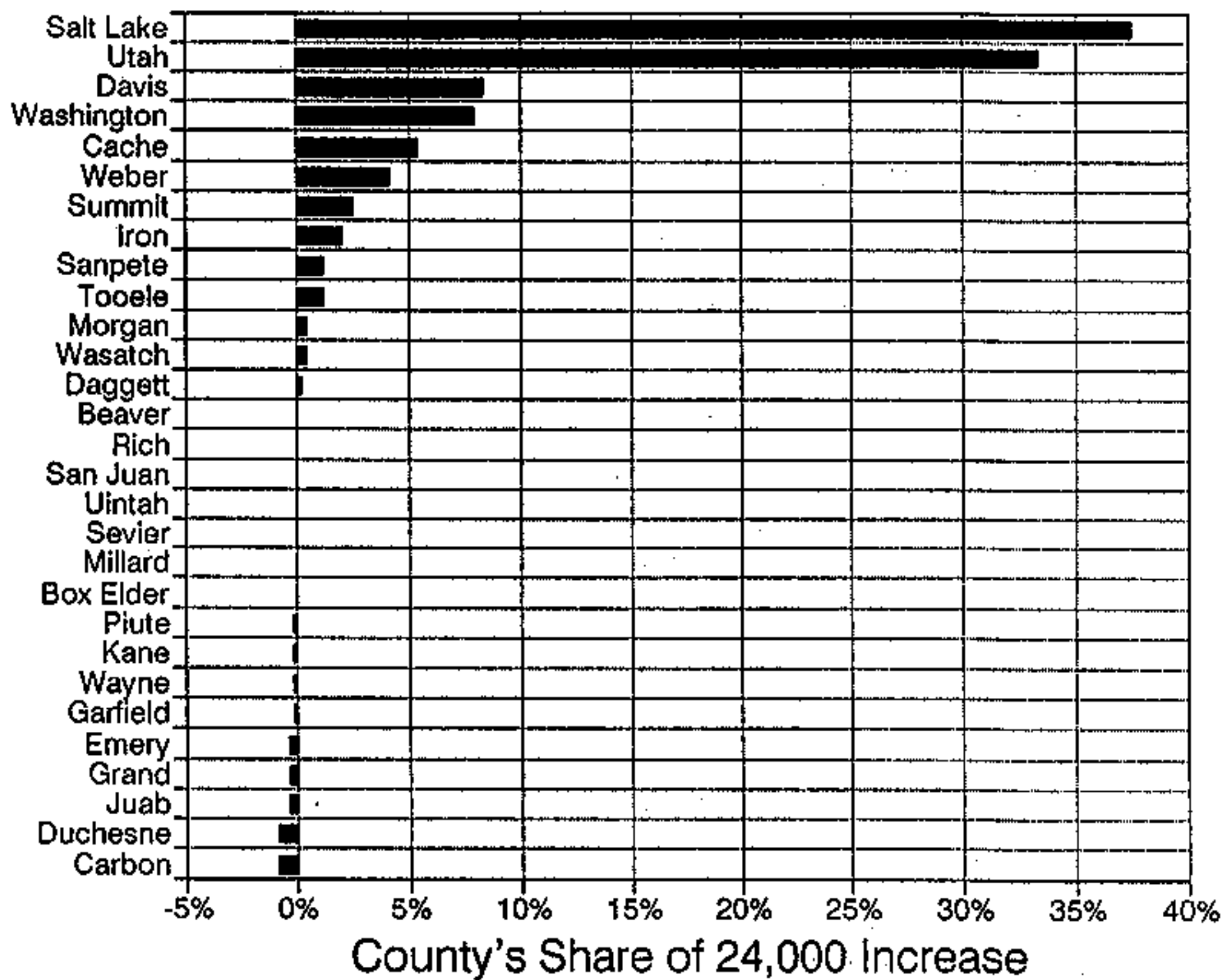

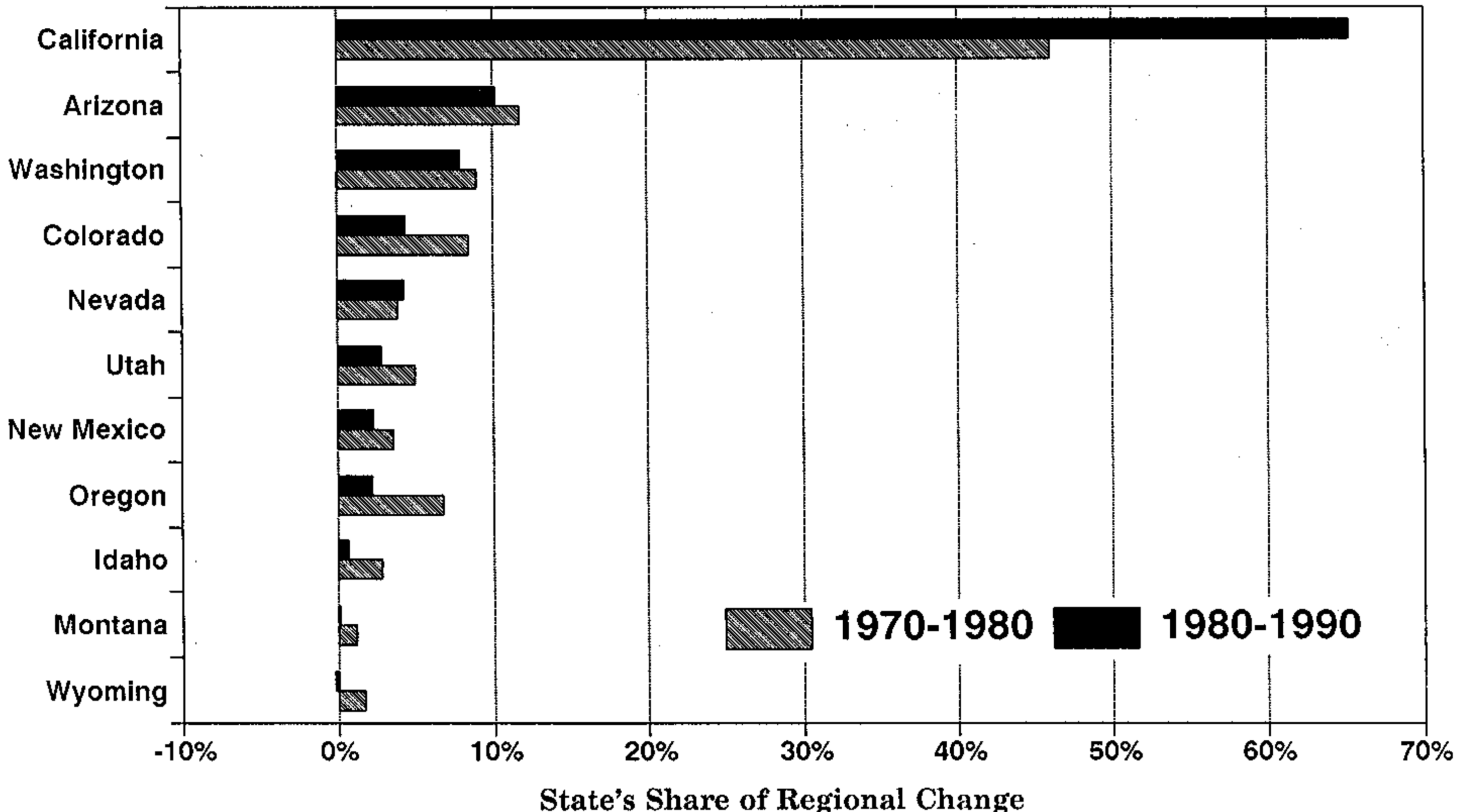
