Analysis in Brief

Utah's capital city stands out from the rest of the state, with higher shares of renters, residents living alone, recent movers, and foreign-born residents, but lower shares of children, commuters who drive to work, and large family households. Still, a closer look at the data highlights a diverse urban landscape—where children under 5 compose 11.4% of one tract's population and less than 1.0% of another. In one neighborhood, over 80% of residents hold bachelor's degrees; while in a different community, less than 20% do. Characteristics like these make each of Salt Lake City's neighborhoods distinct and unique.

Created to inform decision-making in city government, this data book provides insights into Salt Lake City's population and households at two levels: city council districts and census tracts. Data from the 2019-2023 American Community is mapped visually and presented in table format.

Key Findings

- Majority Multi-Family Housing The majority (54.9%) of housing units in Salt Lake City are located in multi-unit structures such as duplexes, townhome complexes, and apartment buildings. Detached single-family homes make up only 44.3% of all housing citywide.
- Capital City College Town More than 1 in 7 city residents (15.2%) are age 18 to 24. Only four other Utah cities (with 20,000 residents) include a larger college-age share: Provo, Logan, Cedar City, and Orem.
- Large Hispanic Population Hispanic or Latino residents compose 20.8% of the capital city population and account for almost half of residents living in City Council Districts 1 and 2 (45.1% and 47.2%, respectively).
- Many Residents Live Alone Nearly 4 in 10 city households (39.3%) are individuals living alone. Oneperson households are most common in City Council District 4, where they comprise 57.1% of households.

- Educational Attainment Varies Although half (50.9%) of Salt Lake City residents age 25 and over have bachelor's or higher degrees, this share ranges from 16.5% to 83.2% across city census tracts.
- Poverty Rates Differ by District In City Council District 2, more than 1 in 5 children (22.8%) live in poverty, the highest rate in the city. In contrast, senior citizens experience the highest rates of poverty in District 7, where 17.3% of those 65 or older live below poverty level.
- More New Neighbors One in five (21.2%) Salt Lake City residents moved addresses within the past year, with 6.2% arriving from out of state. In comparison, 14.0% of residents statewide moved in the past year, with 2.9% coming from out of state.
- Multi-Modal Commuters In Salt Lake City, 68.3% of workers (age 16 and older) drive to their place of work, compared to 78.9% of workers in Utah overall. One in ten Salt Lake City households does not have a vehicle, reflecting the 11.7% of city residents who walk, bike, or utilize public transit to travel to work.

Databook Notes

This analysis is based on the 5-Year 2019-2023 American Community Survey (ACS) estimates, shared at census tract and city-level. Table data is presented alongside a reliability measure (coefficient of variation).

City council district data is an approximation and was calculated by the Kem C. Gardner Policy Institute. Median measures and coefficient of variation are not available for these geographies.

Several census tracts were omitted from this analysis due to high percentages of residents living outside of Salt Lake City or low population counts overall. See the geography notes and data notes at the end of the report for more information.

Population and Household Estimates

Salt Lake City accounted for 6.1% of Utah's overall population in the 2019-2023 American Community Survey (ACS) 5-Year Estimates. These 5-year estimates serve as the denominators for the percentages presented throughout this book and are presented for this reason. Single-year estimates reveal Salt Lake City grew in population over this five-year period, its population increasing by about 9,000 residents (4.5%) to 209,606 in 2023.

In the 2019-2023 ACS Five-Year Estimates, Salt Lake City included just under 90,000 households, representing 8.1% of households statewide.

Total Population and Households

Salt Lake City's most populous city council district is District 4, which includes the Central City and East Central neighborhoods, and part of downtown. It accounts for 17.0% of the city's population, with 34,713 residents and 20,251 households.

Council District 2 is the city's smallest district by population, encompassing Glendale and Poplar Grove, and making up 11.9% of the city's population. District 2 includes 24,268 residents and 8,086 households.

Census tracts in Salt Lake City range in population from 1,497 residents in the northern section of Capitol Hill (C1) to 6,884 residents in Fairpark (W7). Household counts also vary greatly, from just 258 households in one University of Utah tract (E3) to 3,220 households in Ballpark (C20). It is worth noting that census tracts also vary in geographic size.





Housing

Salt Lake City's housing landscape includes a higher share of renters and more multi-unit structures than the state. More than half of Salt Lake City households (53.2%) are rentals, compared to 29.4% at the state level. The other 46.8% of city householders own their homes.

Multi-unit structures account for the majority (54.9%) of Salt Lake City's housing units, while detached single-family homes make up 44.3% of all housing units. Over one-third (35.0%) of the city's housing units are in structures with ten or more units. Townhomes, duplexes, triplexes, and structures with up to nine units compose another 19.9% of housing citywide.

Tenure

Within Salt Lake City, renting is most common in City Council Districts 4 and 3, where 78.2% and 61.4% of householders rent, respectively. Renting is most prevalent among households located near the center of Salt Lake City or near the University of Utah. All households in tracts E2 and E3 at the University of Utah (100.0%) rent - the highest share of renters in the city. Tracts C13 (Central City) and C9 (Downtown) follow, with over 88% renting households.

In contrast, homeownership is most common in City Council District 6, where 75.5% of households are owner-occupied. City Council Districts 2 and 1, on the city's west side, include the second and third highest homeownership rates, at 59.8% and 58.6%. Homeownership rates are highest in Avenues tract E1, where 91.9% of households are owner-occupied. Four other tracts throughout the city have homeownership rates over 80%: tracts W2 in Rose Park, W3 in Westpointe, E8 in Bonneville Hills, and E6 on the East Bench.

Units in Structure

Over one-third (35.0%) of Salt Lake City housing units are in structures with ten or more units. These multi-family developments account for 68.9% of the housing units in City Council District 4 (the highest share in the city), but less than 15% of units in Districts 2 and 6. More than 90% of housing in tracts C9 and C10 Downtown and C12 in Central City fall into this category. However, five city tracts do not include any of these multi-family structures (0%): C1 in Capitol Hill, C22 in East Liberty, E7 in Wasatch Hollow, E15 in Sugarhouse, and W2 in Rose Park.

Smaller multi-family structures, with less than ten units, compose an additional 1 in 5 Salt Lake City housing units (19.9%). This category includes townhouses, duplexes, triplexes, and apartment buildings with up to nine units. These housing types are most common in Districts 3, 5, and 7, making up about a quarter of each district's housing. In tracts C15 in East Central and E12 in Sugarhouse, these units comprise almost half of all housing units, the highest shares city-wide.

Detached single-family homes make up 44.3% of Salt Lake City's housing. These houses compose three-quarters (74.9%) of the housing units in City Council District 6, the highest share citywide. City Council District 2 includes the next highest share of single-family homes, 68.7%. In eleven tracts citywide, more than 75% of housing units are single-family homes. Of these, four tracts are west of I-15 (W2, W3, W9, W11), one is in the Avenues (E1), and six are in the southeast corner of the city (E4, E7, E8, E10, E14, E15). Tract W2 in Rose Park has the highest share of single-family homes citywide, 98.6%.

Median Year of Move-In

Citywide, the median move-in year for renting households in Salt Lake City is 2019. Tract W2 in Rose Park had the city's earliest median move in year for renters: 2015. Other tracts with high stability in renters include tracts C1 (Capitol Hill), W8 (Poplar Grove), and W11 (Glendale), which share a median move-in year of 2017. At the other end of the range, tract E3 at the University of Utah has the most recent median move-in year for renters: 2022. Tracts C2 in the Marmalade neighborhood of Capitol Hill is next, with a median move in year of 2021 for renters.

Homeowners in Salt Lake City have a median move-in year of 2011. However, this varies greatly, with owner-occupied households in the central part of Salt Lake City having more recent median move-in years. Six tracts have a median move-in year of 2016, the latest in the city: tract C9, C10, C11, and C12 Downtown, C18 in East Central, and C20 in Ballpark. The oldest median move in year for homeowners is 2001, found in tracts W12 in Glendale and C15 in East Central. Other tracts with many long-term residents and less turnover in owner-occupied homes include C4 in the Avenues (2005), C19 in East Central (2004), and W2 in Rose Park (2005).

Figure 3: Renter-Occupied Share of Households



Figure 4: Owner-Occupied Share of Households



Figure 5: Single-Family Homes as a Share of Housing Units



Figure 6: Townhomes and 2 to 9 Units in Structure as a Share of Housing Units



Figure 7: Ten or More Units in Structure as a Share of Housing Units



Salt Lake City and Census Tracts, 2023 Five-Year Estimates



Salt Lake City and Census Tracts, 2023 Five-Year Estimates



Race and Hispanic or Latino Origin

Salt Lake City is more racially and ethnically diverse than the state, with over one-third (35.3%) of its population identifying as non-White or of Hispanic or Latino origin. Statewide, almost 1 in 4 residents (24.3%) identify within a racial or ethnic minority group. Six other Utah cities (with 10,000 residents) have higher non-White or Hispanic shares: West Valley City (58.0%), Kearns (52.6%), South Salt Lake (47.6%), Magna (46.0%), Taylorsville (39.6%), and Ogden (38.4%).

Within Salt Lake City, City Council Districts 1 and 2 have the most racially and ethnically diverse populations. The rest of the city council districts are predominantly non-Hispanic White, with the highest non-Hispanic White shares in Districts 6 and 7.

Hispanic or Latino

Both statewide and in Salt Lake City, the Hispanic or Latino population is the second largest racial or ethnic population, composing 15.4% of the state and 20.8% of the capital city population. City Council Districts 1 and 2 have the highest shares of Hispanic or Latino residents at 45.1% and 47.2%, respectively. In five tracts west of I-15, more than half of residents identify as Hispanic or Latino. These tracts are in Westpoint (W3, W4), Jordan Meadows (W6), Poplar Grove (W10), and Glendale (W11).

Non-Hispanic Asian

In Salt Lake City, the third-largest racial or ethnic population identifies as non-Hispanic Asian, at 5.3%. Districts 1 and 4 exceed this city-level share, with 7.4% and 6.5% of residents identifying as Asian, respectively. The tract with the highest Asian share is located at the University of Utah (E3), where 23.1% of residents are Asian. Tracts in Westpointe (W3), and in the Avenues (C6) follow, with just over 14% Asian residents.

Non-Hispanic Some Other Race or Multi-Racial

In Salt Lake City, this group is the fourth largest racial or ethnic group at 4.8% of the population. Four city council districts include larger shares of Non-Hispanic Some Other Race or Multi-Racial residents: Districts 3 (6.1%), 4 (5.9%), 5 (5.1%), and 6 (5.6%). In five city tracts, this group composes at least 10% of the total population. These tracts are located downtown (C10, C12), and in Foothill/Sunnyside (E5), Wasatch Hollow (E7), and Fairpark (W7).

Non-Hispanic Black or African American, American Indian and Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander

These three races combined make up 4.4% of the Salt Lake City population, with the non-Hispanic Black or African-American population being the largest of the three at 2.4% citywide (over 4,800 people). Another 1.4% of Salt Lake City's population identify as non-Hispanic Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, and 0.6% identify as non-Hispanic American Indian or Alaska Native (about 2,900 and 1,300 people, respectively). City Council District 2 has the largest shares of Black or African American residents (5.3%), American Indian and Alaska Native residents (2.6%), and Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander residents (4.8%) in the city.

Figure 10: Non-Hispanic White Population



Figure 11: Hispanic or Latino Population



Figure 12: Non-Hispanic Black or African American Population



Figure 13: Non-Hispanic American Indian and Alaska Native Population



Figure 14: Non-Hispanic Asian Population



Figure 15: Non-Hispanic Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander Population



Figure 16: Non-Hispanic Some Other Race and Two or More Races Population



Figure 17: Minority Racial and Ethnic Populations Combined



Salt Lake City is older than the state, with a median age of 33.0, compared to 31.7 state-wide.¹ Salt Lake City's higher median age is due to a lower share of children and higher shares of college-age and working-age residents. The neighborhoods west of I-15 have higher shares of children than other parts of the city, while the city center is home to higher shares of working-age adults.

Children (Under 5 and School-Age)

Statewide, 28.3% of residents are children (7.1% under age 5, 21.2% ages 5 to 17). In Salt Lake City, 17.0% of city residents are children (4.9% under age 5, 12.1% ages 5 to 17). In City Council Districts 1 and 2, youth under age 18 compose about one-quarter of residents — the highest in the city. In contrast, City Council District 4 has the lowest share of children, just 6.0%.

Tract-level data matches these findings, with the highest shares of children under 5 found in Westpoint (W4) and Poplar Grove (W10) and the highest shares of school-aged children in Westpoint (W4) and Glendale (W12).

College-Age

Salt Lake City is home to the University of Utah, Westminster College, Salt Lake Community College South City campus, Neumont University, and Ensign College. In addition to many employment opportunities, these institutions contribute to four tracts in the city where more than one in three people are in the college-age (18 to 24) group. In the two tracts overlapping the University of Utah campus, over half of the population is college-age, with 67.3% of residents in tract E2 and 50.7% in tract E3 aged 18 to 24. Another two tracts in the East Central neighborhood, just west of the University of Utah, also have high shares of college-age residents: C15 (44.8%) and C14 (38.3%).

Working-Age

Salt Lake City is an economic and employment hub for the state, with a high share of working-age residents. Over half (55.6%) of Salt Lake City's population is between ages 25 and 64, with over 60% of City Council Districts 4 and 5 in this age group. Tract E12 in Sugarhouse has the highest share of working-age adults at 76.9%. Two additional tracts have three-quarters of their population between ages 25 and 64: tracts C10 (76.7%) and C12 (75.0%) Downtown.

Retirement-Age

Salt Lake City and the state have similar shares of retirementage residents (aged 65 or over): 12.2% of city residents compared to 11.6% at the state level. Within Salt Lake City, City Council District 3 has the highest share of retirement-age residents (17.2%). In two city tracts, more than one-quarter of residents are age 65 or older: E1 in the Avenues and C5 in Capitol Hill. City Council District 2 has the lowest share of retirement-age residents: 9.6%. Three tracts located at the University of Utah and in Central City (E2, E3, C12) have less than 5% of their populations in this age group.

Median Age

Salt Lake City is older than the state, with a median age of 33.0 years compared to 31.7 state-wide. There are two tracts in the city with a median age over 45 years, located in the Avenues (E1) and on the East Bench (E6).

Tracts E2 and E3, home to the University of Utah, have the lowest median ages at 21.2 and 23.4 years, respectively. Other tracts with low median ages include C14 and C15 in East Central, and W4 in Rose Park.

Figure 18: Children Under Age 5



Figure 19: School-Age Population (5 to 17 years)



Figure 20: College-Age Population (18 to 24 years)



Figure 21: Working-Age Population (25 to 64 years)



Figure 22: Retirement-Age Population (65 years and over)



Figure 23: Median Age



Households

Salt Lake City's unique demographics are reflected in different household compositions than the state.

Nearly 4 in 10 city households are individuals living alone, compared to 2 in 10 households statewide. It is also more common for Salt Lake City residents to share housing with roommates who are not related to them, an arrangement that describes 15.0% of households in Salt Lake City but only 6.8% of households in Utah.

While more than one-third (35.2%) of Utah households include children under 18, only 17.7% of Salt Lake City households have children living in them. Households that include children in Salt Lake City are also more likely to be single-parent households than they are at the state level. Three in ten (30.3%) city households with children are led by a single parent, compared to two in ten (19.2%) statewide.

Utah is known for large family households, with families of 5 or more composing 18.1% of households statewide. These large families are less common in Salt Lake City, where they compose only 6.6% of households. Households that include individuals age 60 or older are also less common in Salt Lake City, where they compose 28.2% of households, compared to 32.9% statewide.

Non-Family Households: Individuals Living Alone and Households With 2+ Persons

In Salt Lake City, over half (54.3%) of households are nonfamily, the second highest of all cities throughout the state (after South Salt Lake).² These households include individuals living alone and householders sharing homes with people who are not related to them, such as roommates, friends, or unmarried partners. Statewide, one in four (26.8%) households is a nonfamily household.

City Council District 4 stands out, where three-quarters (78.6%) of households have nonfamily arrangements. Over half of Districts 3, 5, and 7 households are also nonfamily.

City Council Districts 3 and 4 include the highest shares of individuals living alone, 45.8% and 57.1%, respectively. In fourteen tracts, all located in the central portion of the city, individuals living alone make up more than half of the total households. This share is largest in tract C13, in Central City, where 73.0% of households are residents living alone.

City Council Districts 4 and 5 include the highest shares of nonfamily households with two or more people. These households make up 21.4% of District 4 and 17.1% of District 5. Citywide, these arrangements are most common in the four tracts that make up the East Central neighborhood of Salt Lake City (C14, C15, C18, C19).

Households With Children Under 18

While children under 18 reside in more than one-third (35.2%) of Utah households, less than one-fifth (17.7%) of Salt Lake City households include a child. Children live in more than one-quarter of the households in City Council Districts 1, 2, and 6, including those with married-couple parents, cohabitating-couple parents, and single parents. In three west-side tracts (W3, W4, W12) and two east-side tracts (E7, E8), over 35% of households include children under 18. In contrast, only 5.6% of City Council District 4 households include children.

Married-Couple with Children: In Salt Lake City, 7 in 10 (69.7%) households with children are married couple households, compared to 8 in 10 (80.8%) at the state level. These married-couple-with-children households compose 12.3% of households in Salt Lake City overall. They make up one-quarter (25.3%) of the

households in City Council District 6, the highest share in the city. In three city tracts, married couple households with children comprise more than 30% of households: E3 at the University of Utah, E7 in Wasatch Hollow, and E8 in Bonneville Heights.

Single-Parent Households: In Salt Lake City, 30.3% of households with children are single-parent households, representing 5.3% of households overall. These households include cohabitating couples with children as well as single adults with children. City Council District 2 has the highest share of single-parent-with-children households, comprising 12.0% of total households. In nine city tracts, at least 10% of households are single-parent households: E15, E16, and E18 in Sugarhouse, W3 and W4 in Westpointe, W6 in Jordan Meadows, W8 in Poplar Grove, and W11 and W12 in Glendale.

Average Household Size and Family Households With 5 or More People

Utah has the largest average household size in the nation at 2.99 people per household. Salt Lake City's average household size is smaller at 2.19 people per household. Within Salt Lake City, the average household size ranges from 1.37 in Central City (C12) to 3.92 in Glendale (W12).

The average household size exceeds three people in five tracts, all west of I-15: W2 in Rose Park, W3 and W4 in Westpoint, and W11 and W12 in Glendale. Salt Lake City's smallest households are in the center of the city, with average household size below 1.5 in Downtown tracts C9 and C12 and Central City tract C13.

Household size trends are echoed in the share of family households with five or more people across the city. City Council Districts 1 and 2 have the highest shares of large family households, 17.3% and 17.2%, respectively. In contrast, only 1.3% of households in District 4 and 2.3% in District 3 are families with five or more people.

Households With Persons Age 60 and Over

Salt Lake City has a lower share of households with people over 60 than the state, at 28.2% compared to 32.9%. District 6 has the highest share of these households (35.2%), while District 4 is the lowest (20.3%). Tract E1, located in the Avenues, has the highest share of households with an individual age 60 or older: 60.2%.

Figure 24: Householders Living Alone




Figure 24: Householders Living Alone

Figure 25: Nonfamily Households With Two or More Persons



Figure 26: Married Couple Households With Children Under 18



Figure 27: Single Householders With Children Under 18



Figure 28: Family Households With Five or More People





Salt Lake City and Census Tracts, 2023 Five-Year Estimates



Socioeconomics

Despite having a higher share of highly educated residents than the state, Salt Lake City experiences higher poverty rates and a lower median income. Wide socioeconomic variation exists across city geographies. Overall poverty rates range from 1.3% in one Sugarhouse neighborhood to 36.2% on the campus of the University of Utah. Likewise, 22.3% of residents in City Council District 2 lack health insurance compared to just 3.3% in District 6.

Income, Poverty, and Health Insurance Coverage

The median household income in Salt Lake City is \$74,925, significantly lower than the state at \$91,750.3 Within the city, household median incomes vary greatly. Tracts E1 in the Avenues and C1 in Capitol Hill have the highest median incomes in the city, exceeding \$175,000. In contrast, tracts E2 at the University of Utah, C16 in Central City, and W8 in Poplar Grove each have median incomes below \$40,000.

In Salt Lake City, 13.3% of households have incomes below the poverty level. This share of households is higher than the state (8.7%). City Council District 4 has the highest share of households in poverty (21.0%), while Districts 6 and 7 have the lowest share of households in poverty, under 10%. Tracts E2 and C15 near the University of Utah have the highest poverty rates, at 36.2% and 34.5%, respectively. Tract C13 in Central City (28.3%) also has more than a quarter of households living below poverty level.

Poverty rates for Salt Lake City's youth population are also elevated compared to the state, with 12.1% of city residents under age 18 living in poverty compared to 8.9% statewide. Child poverty rates are highest in City Council District 2, where 22.8% of children live in households below poverty level.

Salt Lake City's senior poverty rate indicates 11.0% of residents 65 and older have incomes below poverty level. Senior poverty

rates are highest in City Council District 7 (17.3%) and lowest in City Council District 6 (3.6%). Although District 2 has the city's highest child poverty rate, it is second lowest for senior poverty at 6.6%.

Districts 1 and 2 have the highest shares of residents without health insurance, 20.7% and 22.3%. The lowest uninsured rate is in District 6, where 3.3% of residents lack health insurance coverage. The highest uninsured rate was reported in tract W4 in Rose Park, where 36.0% of residents are uninsured.

Educational Attainment of the Population Age 25 Years and Over

Half (50.9%) of Salt Lake City residents aged 25 and over have a bachelor's degree or higher. This share is over ten percentage points higher than the state share (36.9%).⁵ In four city council districts, over half of the population has a bachelor's degree or higher (3, 4, 6, and 7), with District 6 being the highest at 76.8%. In Districts 1 and 2, less than one-quarter of residents 25 and older hold bachelor's degrees, while in District 5, 48.9% do.

In five city tracts, more than 75% of residents hold bachelor's degrees. All are in the city's eastern part: E1, E4, E5, E6, and E8. Meanwhile, fewer than one in five residents hold a bachelor's degree in four city tracts. These tracts are located west of I-15: W3, W4, W11, and W12.

While the share of those with higher education in Salt Lake City is higher than the state, the share of those without a high school diploma is also higher. In Salt Lake City, 8.4% of residents do not have their high school diplomas, compared to roughly 7% of Utahns state-wide. City Council Districts 1 and 2 have the highest shares of residents without a high school diploma (19.4% and 22.0%). Poplar Grove tract W8 has the highest share in the city, at 35.7%.

Salt Lake City and Census Tracts, 2023 Five-Year Estimates



Figure 32: Households With Incomes Below Poverty Level



Figure 33: Youth (Under Age 18) Below Poverty Level





Figure 35: Population with No Health Insurance



Figure 36: Population Age 25 and Over with Less than a High School Diploma



Figure 37: Population 25 and Over With a High School Diploma or Equivalent



Figure 38: Population 25 and Older with an Associate's Degree



Figure 39: Population 25 and Over with a Bachelor's or Higher Degree



Movers and Place of Birth

Salt Lake City's population includes more recent movers and a larger share of foreign-born residents than the state. In Salt Lake City, 15.0% of residents moved from within Utah in the past year, while another 6.2% of city residents relocated from out of state. In comparison, 11.1% of all Utahns moved within the state, and 2.9% came from other states in the past year. While 61.3% of Utahns state-wide were born in Utah, only 46.3% of Salt Lake City residents were born in-state. Additionally, 15.4% of Salt Lake City's population is foreign-born, compared to 8.6% of Utahns statewide.

Movers From Other States and Within Utah

The share of residents who moved from other parts of Utah in the past year is highest in City Council District 4 (22.2%), followed by District 3 (15.7%). City Council District 1 includes the smallest share of recent in-state movers, at 11.3%. In three tracts city-wide, more than one-third of the population moved from within Utah in the past year: E2 and E3 at the University of Utah and C13 in Central City.

City Council District 4 also has the highest share of residents who moved from other states or abroad in the past year: 10.7%. City Council District 2 had the lowest, at 1.3%. Tracts E2 and E3 at the University of Utah had the highest shares of out-of-state movers: 24.8% and 21.7%, respectively. The next highest were tracts C6 in the Avenues (19.8%), C11 Downtown (17.9%), and E13 in Sugarhouse (16.8%).

Foreign-born

More than 1 in 10 (11.0%) foreign-born Utahns reside in Salt Lake City, composing 15.4% of the city population overall. In City Council Districts 1 and 2, more than one-quarter of the population is foreign-born (27.9% and 26.9%, respectively), while foreign-born residents make up less than 15% of the population in all other districts. Eight tracts city-wide have at least one-quarter or more of their populations born outside the United States. Six of these tracts are west of I-15 (W3, W4, W6, W8, W9, and W11), one is at the University of Utah (E3), and one is Downtown (C9), with the highest foreign-born share in Jordan Meadows tract W6, at 44.2%.

Limited English-Speaking Households

In Salt Lake City, 3.8% of households are limited English-speaking, or households in which all members 14 years old and over have some difficulty speaking English. In comparison, 2.1% of households statewide are considered limited English-speaking. Council District 2 has the highest share of these households at 11.2%. More than 10% of households in six city tracts are limited English-speaking: W4 in Rose Park, W6 in Jordan Meadows, W8 and W10 in Poplar Grove, W12 in Glendale, and E3 at the University of Utah.

Born in Utah

The share of residents born in Utah ranges from 36.3% in City Council District 4 to 52.7% in City Council District 7. Tracts W2 in Rose Park and E15 and E16 in Sugarhouse have the highest shares of residents born in Utah, over 60%. In contrast, the lowest shares of Utah-born residents are found in three tracts in the Avenues and Central City: C6, C12, and C13. In each of these tracts, less than one-third of residents were born in Utah.

Figure 40: Moved in the Last 12 Months From Within Utah



Figure 41: Moved in the Last 12 Months from a Different State or Abroad



Figure 42: Foreign-Born Population



Figure 43: Limited English-Speaking Households



Figure 44: Population Born in Utah



Commuting

In Salt Lake City, 68.3% of workers (age 16 and older) drive to their place of work, compared to 78.9% of workers in Utah overall. Compared to the state, higher shares of workers in Salt Lake City bike or walk to work (6.5% vs. 2.5%) and utilize public transit to travel to work (5.2% vs. 1.7%). Additionally, 18.5% of workers in Salt Lake City work from home, compared to 16.0% of workers statewide. One in ten Salt Lake City households do not have a vehicle, over two-and-a-half times the share seen at the state level (3.9%).

Driving to Work (Including Carpooling)

In the communities west of I-15 in Salt Lake City, about 4 in 5 workers drive to their place of work, with 78.9% of workers in District 1 and 81.4% of workers in District 2 driving to work each day. In all other districts, less than 70% of workers drive to work, with the smallest share in District 4 at 57.3%. In Westpointe tract W4 and Glendale tract W12, more than 90% of workers drive to work, the highest shares in the city. In contrast, only 35.6% of workers in Central City tract C13 drive to work.

Walking or Biking to Work

The share of workers who walk or bike to work is highest in District 4 (12.3%) and lowest in Districts 1 (2.5%) and 7 (3.1%). These methods are most common in tracts C12 in Central City and E2 and E3 at the University of Utah, where more than one in five workers walk or bike to work. In six city tracts, less than 1% of workers walk or bike to work: C2 in Capitol Hill, E12, E15, and E18 in Sugarhouse, W3 in Westpointe, and W6 in Jordan Meadows.

Public Transit to Work

Public transit is utilized by the largest share of working residents in District 4 (8.3%) and the smallest share of workers in District 2 (1.9%). One in five workers (22.4%) in tract C13 in Central City and nearly one in six workers in tracts E12 in Sugarhouse (16.7%) and E3 at the University of Utah (16.2%) travel to work on public transit, the highest rates in the city. In contrast, no workers reported utilizing public transit in five city tracts: C1 in Capitol Hill, E6 on the East Bench, E16 in Sugarhouse, W10 in Poplar Grove, and W12 in Glendale.

Working from Home

Rates of workers working from home differ greatly between western Salt Lake City and the rest of the city. While 11.8% of District 1 and 10.4% of District 2 workers are based at home, rates hover around 20% in the other five districts, with the highest rate of 23.4% found in District 7. More than one-quarter of workers work from home in eleven city tracts: C6 and E1 in the Avenues, C11 Downtown, C18 in East Central, C21 in Central City, E6 on the East Bench, E7 in Wasatch Hollow, E8 in Bonneville Hills, and E9, E13, and E14 in Sugarhouse.

Zero Vehicle Households

Vehicle ownership also varies throughout the city. In City Council District 4, nearly one in five (19.0%) households do not own a vehicle. In contrast, zero-vehicle households compose only 2.3% of City Council District 6 households. In five centrally located city tracts, more than one-quarter of households report not having a vehicle: C9 and C10 Downtown, C12 and C13 in Central City, and C16 in Sugarhouse.

Figure 45: Workers 16 and Over Who Drive to Work



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Figure 46: Workers 16 and Over Who Walk or Bike to Work



Figure 47: Workers 16 and Over Who Use Public Transit to Travel to Work



Figure 48: Workers 16 and Over Who Work From Home



Figure 49: Households With Zero Vehicles



Data Notes

American Community Survey

The American Community Survey (ACS) is an ongoing survey conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau that provides information on the social and economic characteristics of communities. The ACS began in 2008 and replaced the decennial Census Long Form in 2010. ACS data are available annually for populations over 65,000 and every five years for all geographies with lower populations.

The data provided by the ACS is based upon a sample rather than a total count of the population and "reflect data that have been collected over a period of time rather than for a single point in time as in the decennial census...".6 Small sample sizes at the tract level sometimes result in large margins of error and can make the data less reliable.

The ACS Five-Year Estimates of population and households provide the denominators for the shares given for all sections of this databook. For example, the share of the population age 65 and older in 2019-2023 in a census tract is calculated out of the estimated 2019-2023 total population for the tract. These denominators are shared at the beginning of the book as a reference point.

ACS Data Analysis and Aggregation

This analysis is based on the 5-year 2019-2023 ACS dataset, using census tract and city-level data. City council districts for Salt Lake City are not ACS geographies, so groups of census tracts were aggregated to approximate ACS estimates. See Reference Figure 1 in the Geography Notes section for a display of which tracts are included in each city council district. Data for these approximated city council districts do not sum to city totals.⁷

Though census tract and city data are reported in the ACS, several data topics in this book require aggregation of multiple estimates to produce desired data topics. For example, multiple age ranges were aggregated to create each age category (age 5 to 17, age 18 to 24, etc.). Approximated margins of error and other statistical values were also calculated for these new, aggregated estimates. Analysts followed Census Bureau recommendations when aggregating estimates and statistical values across geographic areas and data subcategories.8

For this Data Book, a coefficient of variation (CV) is employed to help readers understand the "fitness for use" of the data. Although there are no set levels of fitness or reliability with the CV, smaller values are considered more reliable than higher values. Guidance provided by the Census Bureau also suggests:

"A general guideline when working with ACS estimates is that, while data are available at low geographic levels, in situations where the CVs for these estimates are high, the reliability of the estimates will be improved by aggregating such estimates to a higher geographic level."9

Data users must use their judgment when applying the values presented in this data book to their specific use cases. One set of suggested guidelines, proposed in 2005 by the National Research Center, uses the following thresholds to analyze the reliability of ACS data:10

- High reliability CV less than or equal to 12
- · Medium reliability CV 13 to 40
- · Low reliability CV over 40

Exceptions

Data aggregation to the city council district level was not possible in five cases, so values are provided for only the city and related census tracts for the following metrics: median year of move-in for renters and owners, median age, average household size, and median household income.

Geography Notes

This book examines communities within Salt Lake City at a census tract level of geography.11 The 2019-2023 American Community Survey 5-Year dataset utilizes 2020 census tract geographies, as tract boundaries do not change between decennial censuses.12

Census tracts divided by city boundaries

Census tracts are sub-geographies of counties and are not designed to correspond with place (city/town) boundaries. As a result, a small number of the tracts included in this book are only partially located inside the Salt Lake City boundary. Treatment for each of these tracts is described below.

- Tracts with more than 30% of their population residing within the Salt Lake City boundary are included in both data tables and maps¹³:
 - W2, where 98.6%14 of the population resides in Salt Lake City
 - E12, where 97.8% of the population resides in Salt Lake City
 - E17, where 96.4% of the population resides in Salt Lake City
 - E18, where 31.3% of the population resides in Salt Lake City.
- Tracts with less than 30% of their population residing within the Salt Lake City boundary are included in data tables but not shown on maps:
 - E17, where 3.2% of the population resides in Salt Lake City.
 - W13, where 1.7% of the population resides in Salt Lake City

The maps and tables in this book present data corresponding to complete tract areas, in some cases including residents living within the boundaries of neighboring cities. City-level data always reflects the Census Bureau's city geography and only includes residents living within that boundary.


Omitted Tracts

The maps presented in this book zoom in on the residential areas in the center of Salt Lake City rather than displaying the city's full geographic footprint. Areas of Salt Lake City zoned for industrial use or open space are largely absent from view. This map frame was selected to facilitate viewing smaller tracts in the city's most populated area. Omitted areas are described below.

- Tract 1139.06, a very large tract located at the westernmost edge of Salt Lake City, is excluded from maps and tables due to its large geographic size and minimal number of Salt Lake City residents. The majority of its residents live in Magna.
- · Tract 1101.03, a very large tract at the city's eastern edge, is excluded from maps and tables due to its large geographic size and minimal number of Salt Lake City residents. The majority of its residents live in Emigration Canyon or Millcreek.
- Tract 9800 (W1) encompasses the Salt Lake City International Airport. Though partially shown in databook maps, data for this tract is excluded from maps and text as it has zero residents.
- Tract 1145 (W13) is split between Salt Lake City and West Valley City. Land areas within the Salt Lake City Boundary are primarily zoned for industrial use, while areas in the West Valley City section of the tract are zoned residential. For this reason, only 1.8% of the tract's 7,819 residents live within Salt Lake City. Data for tract W13 is included in tables but not represented on maps or discussed in text, as values mainly reflect the West Valley City population.


The Kem C. Gardner Policy Institute created the tract codes shown in maps and tables as an abbreviated method of referring to tracts. The letters W, C, and E in tract codes roughly correspond to the city's west, central, and east areas. When tracts are discussed in the text, a Salt Lake City community council may be used alongside the tract code to provide context for the tract location. The Salt Lake City Census Tracts and Community Council Districts map (Reference Figure 2) displays both tract and community council boundaries.
